The company is facing unprecedented transformation due to the shifting regulatory environment, the removal of legacy public service obligations and the need for modernization of its hydropower plants and PSHPPs. Hydropower is a crucial enabler for the energy transition, while at the same time it encounters many challenges due to the technology specifics and the complexity of the projects. Thus, the need arises for a united voice and a holistic approach to the hydropower value chain with participation and contribution of all major actors across Europe.
